

REMOTE LEARNING 4.0 SURVEY RESULTS



We would like to thank everyone who completed the Remote Learning 4.0 Survey.



It is extremely important to us that we are catering to the needs of our families.




Spread of Year level responses.




Please select the comments that were true for your child's wellbeing

How can we improve remote learning?



We received 82 written responses to 'Any other comments?' Below is a small selection of these comments.

Overall, we are extremely happy with the program. The one thing my child misses most is seeing her teacher and peer. If feasible, it would be great to introduce one hour each day (eg. 9-10am) where her class group can meet up via zoom with their teacher during remote learning. This would really help to motivate my child and her overall well-being during these lock downs as she always looks forward to the WebEx conferences.

Everyone has done really well- we feel so lucky to be a part of Bellaire

I'd like less organised teacher time (webex meetings etc). Limit to once a week max. No need to call parents to check in, just let us know where to go if we aren't coping. The more flexible the better. Paper worksheets provide interest and additional skills for prep-2s there is colouring, cutting and pasting which makes the task more enjoyable for everyone.

I think Bellaire has done an incredible job with remote learning. I love that the message has always been 'wellbeing comes first' and 'do what you can'. The systems put in place by the school have been clear and easy to use. We have always felt supported and connected with the school during remote learning. Thank you to leadership team and staff for going above and beyond.

I feel the remote learning provided for our children from Bellaire has been really great. I love the fact that we can work at our own pace and times to suit home life/learning balance. The teachers get back to us so swiftly even though they have their own lives at home to balance too, it's really great! I like the fact that although you encourage the learning most, there is also support for us to do what we can at home without judgement or force to complete everything set out. Thank you so much for the support teachers.

Provide more one on one webex teacher time to support kids in completing work during the webex (not just a check in phone call), this would reduce kids stress and parents too, kids can also feel more connected to their teacher and receive additional support to better understand their work activities when needed.

I think, under these very quick circumstances, that the teachers in the prep unit are doing a wonderful job! My preppie is very excited to begin the activities each day, loves seeing his teachers on video, and is enjoying the work set. It is a perfect balance between enough to keep him occupied/engaged and not so much that it is overwhelming for us as a family. Thanks

I would prefer not to have the multiple messages per day, particularly the afternoon one. Once school work is done for the day we move on from it and it adds no value to have a message later on. For parents with multiple children and also juggling their own work commitments the number of messages can be ridiculous.

As a parent working from home the amount of work is good, the flexibility of being able to work at our own pace works well and having the different levels of difficulty is a great option as well. Teacher is really responsive and we know is available if we need anything.

I believe more work in books would be good. These students are on their iPads enough. Getting off the iPad to complete work would be great. Overall, the flexibility is fantastic. Some parents I know think that more work should be provided and you will never please everyone but kids have survived with long amounts of time off school for travel or illness. Less is more in this case. Webex is good for the mental health of kids, check in. I think they could benefit from a daily check in.

More Webex meetings perhaps each day at the beginning if students want to attend, - I found one meeting a week wasn't enough as it seemed to always fall on the days I was at work so my kids missed out.

It has helped having more frequent webex sessions this time particularly for the older students. It has definitely helped to keep the energy up.
