

**PREP LEARNING UNIT – REMOTE LEARNING LIBRARY BOOK RESPONSE**

Each week there will be two stories shared with you as part of Library. Once you have listened to these stories, you might like to choose your favourite and do an activity from below. These activities can be done in your workbook, or directly filmed/recorded onto SeeSaw through the 'Activities' tab.

<p><b>Characters</b> Draw the characters from the story and have a go at writing their names. You might even like to put a circle around your favourite character. Try and make your pictures detailed with lots of colour.</p>	<p><b>Setting</b> Draw the settings from the story and have a go at labelling your pictures Try and make your pictures detailed with lots of colour.</p>	<p><b>Event</b> Think about what happened in the story and draw a picture of your favourite event. Have a go at writing a sentence to explain your picture.</p>	<p><b>Act it out</b> Think about your favourite part of the story. Have a go at acting out the scene.  You can record this directly into See Saw. Next to the library video, click on "add response" and select "video".</p>
<p><b>Design a front cover</b> Think about the story and look at the front cover. What has the author and illustrator included? What else could be added? Have a go at creating your own front cover and draw all the things you think should be included. Remember to use lots of colour.</p>	<p><b>Making connections – Text to Self</b> After reading the story, think about events/characters/settings that relate to you. Divide your page into two sections. On one side, draw something that happened in the story and on the other side, draw your connection.  E.g. – Pig the Grub loved to get muddy. Miss Pickering's text to self-connection is that her dog Ludo loves to play in the mud too.</p>	<p><b>Create a Mask</b> Using a piece of paper, have a go at creating a mask that looks like one of the characters from the story. You might even like to act out a scene and put your mask to use.</p>	<p><b>Beginning/Middle/End</b> Divide your page into three sections and write the headings, 'Beginning, Middle, End.'  Draw a picture in each section about what happened in the story. Try and make your pictures detailed with lots of colour.</p>
<p><b>Change the ending</b> Think about what happened in the story and use your imagination to think of a different ending. Draw a picture of your new ending, or maybe even act it out.  E.g - At the end of the Three Little Pigs the wolf couldn't blow down the brick house and the pigs were safe. Instead of this ending, the wolf might have been lonely so the three pigs let him inside to join them and then they became friends.</p>	<p><b>Create a character</b> Use your imagination and have a go at making up your very own character to join the story. Draw this character with lots of detail. You can either write a sentence or record yourself explaining who this new fantastic character is. If you would like to, you can record this directly into See Saw. Next to the library video, click on "add response" and select "video".</p>	<p><b>Writing</b> Have a go at writing about what happened in the story. You can draw a picture of what you have written to match. When you have finished, you might like to record yourself reading what you have written. You can record this directly into See Saw.</p>	<p><b>Retell the story</b> Record yourself retelling the story. What happened in the story? Who were the characters? Where was the story set?  You can record this directly into See Saw. Next to the library video, click on "add response" and select "video".</p>
